A stump hole and fir roots, bears N. 30° E.,
25 lks. dist.

A broken fir snag, 54 ins. diam., bears
S. 26° E., 89 lks. dist., with fragmentary
scribe marks visible on bottom of bark blaze.

A stump hole, bears S. 5° W., 71 lks. dist.

A down and rotted fir, 30 ins. diam., bears
N. 55° W., 21 lks. dist., no markd visible.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 25 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 4 ins. diam., bears S. 16° E., 139 lks.
dist., mkd. T22S R8W S12 BT.

A hemlock, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 21° W., 16 lks.
dist., mkd. T22S R8W S11 BT.

A white fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 22° W.,
56 lks. dist., mkd. T22S R8W S2 BT.

Land, mountainous.
Soil, sandy clay loam.
Timber, scattering fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, and
alder; undergrowth, vinemaple, hazel, arrowwood,
huckleberry, salmonberry, thimbleberry, salal, and fern.

From the cor. of secs. 11, 12, 13, and 14.

N. 89° 03' W., bet. secs. 11 and 14.

Descend 110 ft. over NW. slope through dense brush
across old logged area.

4.80 Little Paradise Creek, 15 lks. wide, course S. 50° W.;
asc. 210 ft. over SE. slope.

14.00 Top of ascent, slopes S.; desc. 105 ft. over SW. slope.

21.30 Ravine, drains S. 10° E.; asc. 40 ft. over SE. slope.

22.60 Spur, slopes S. 10° E.; desc. 145 ft. over SW. slope.

27.30 Little Paradise Creek, 15 lks. wide, course N. 55° W.;
asc. 345 ft. over NE. slope.

39.80 Spur slopes N.; desc. 20 ft. over NW. slope.

41.16 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 11 and 14, at pro-
portionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of
the original corner.
