A white oak, 42 ins. diam., bears N. $80\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 705 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

A sawed white oak stump, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 25° W., 7 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

and a bearing tree and bearing object marked by the County Surveyor in 1964

A white oak, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 1° W., 143 lks. dist., with scribe marks WC NE DLC 45 CS BT visible on unhealed double blaze.

A power pole, No. 6-306-307, bears N. 80° E., 33 lks. dist.

Land, south half mile mountainous, north half mile nearly level.

Soil, sandy clay loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, madrone, myrtle, and chinquapin; undergrowth, vinemaple, hazel, poison oak, manzanita, arrowwood, huckleberry, salal, salmonberry, ceanothus, blackberry, and fern.

Note:

The line between secs. 20 and 29 was run in two parts, the east portion was surveyed by Harvey Gordon and Charles T. Gardner in 1855-56 and the west portion was surveyed by William H. Byars in 1881. The two portions of the line were not connected or tied together in the original survey, therefore, during this survey the west segment of the line was projected West, record bearing and distance from the cor. of secs. 20, 21, 28, and 29, and the west segment of the line was projected East, record bearing and distance from the cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29, and 30, and a tie made between the terminal points of the lines.

West, bet. secs. 20 and 29.

Descend 6 ft. across open field.

7.00 Left bank of Umpqua River; desc. 35 ft. over river bank.

8.45 Enter river, course S. 85° W.; thence in river.

9.70 Point for meander cor. bet. secs. 20 and 29, at record bearing and distance, falls in river; no permanent monument established.

30.00 Point for meander cor. bet. secs. 20 and 29, at record
