Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional lines, T. 21 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS

The area is drained by Paradise Creek draining southwesterly into the Umpqua River, and Halfway Creek draining northwesterly into Smith River. Access into the area is gained by way of Paradise Ridge Road and Tom Folly Creek Road branching from Oregon State Highway No. 38.

Timber in the area consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, dogwood, chinquapin, madrone and yew. The undergrowth is mainly salal, huckleberry, vine maple, poison oak, blackberry, ceanothus, arrowwood, hazel, salmonberry, rhododendron, Oregon grape, vines and ferns.

No mineral deposits were noted along the lines resurveyed.

The average of a number of readings along the lines resurveyed gives a value of $20^{\circ} 00'$ E. in mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 45' in local attraction.
