40.69	The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7, and 8, perpetuated and recorded by J. W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1959, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., protruding 12 ins. above ground, firmly set, with brass cap mkd.

	A madrone, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 40° W., 40 lks. dist., with scribe marks S7 T28S R4W visible on opened and rotted blaze.

	A fir, 57 ins. diam., bears N. 67½° E., 77 lks. dist., with a pitched over blaze.
	A fir, 23 ins. diam., bears S. 7° E., 21½ lks. dist., with a pitched over double blaze.
	A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 16° W., 24 lks. dist., with scribe marks T28S R4W S7 BT visible on partially healed double blaze.
	A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 8° W., 34 lks. dist., with a healed double blaze.
	Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, madrone, oak, maple, ash, alder, and pine; undergrowth, salal, vine maple, fern, poison oak, hazel, arrowwood, blackberry, ceanothus, wild rose, and young timber.
	N. 0° 08' W., bet. secs. 5 and 6.
	Ascend slightly along E. slope, through heavy timber and medium undergrowth.
4.50	Spur, slopes E.; desc. 60 ft. over NE. slope.
7.35	Bottom of descent, drains E.; asc. 25 ft. over SE. slope.
9.60	Top of ascent, slopes E.; desc. 40 ft. over NE. slope.
11.85	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course E.; asc. 50 ft. over SE. slope.
16.10	Top of ascent, slopes SE.; desc. 20 ft. over NE. slope.
19.00	Bottom of descent, drains E.; asc. 175 ft. over SE. slope.
24.30	Wire fence, bears W., and E., 20 lks. to a fence corner, thence N.
25.20	Spur ridge, bears N. 70° E. and S. 60° W., enter burned and logged area, edge bears the same; desc. 150 ft. over NW. slope.
29.30	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N. 60° W.; desc 160 ft. along W. slope, changing to N. slope.
38.78	Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
