CHAINS

from which new bearing trees

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 85° E., 132 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S19 BT.

A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears S. 55° E., 52 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S19 BT.

No evidence of the bearing trees marked in 1945 can be found.

N. 0° 20' E., on the W. bdy., of sec. 19, T. 21 S., R. 8 W., marking and blazing the true line.

Descend 135 ft. over N. slope, through logged area and dense undergrowth.

2.55 Big Creek, 10 lks. wide, course S. 80° E.; asc. 700 ft. over S. slope, changing to SW. slope.

5.10 Gravelled road, 25 lks. wide, bears E. and W.

34.00 Ridge, bears N. 10° W. and S. 45° E.; desc. 2 ft. along E. slope.

36.04 The closing cor. of secs. 13 and 24, monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., extending 8 ins. above ground, firmly set, with brass cap marked

A decayed hemlock stump, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 47° W., 33 lks. dist., with no marks remaining.

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 17° W., 68 lks. dist., mkd. T21S, R9W S13 CC BT.
