A rock outcropping, bears N. 87° W., 39½ lks. dist., mkd. X B0

From this point United States Coast and Geodetic Survey triangulation station SCARE 1953, bears N. 60° 57' W., 10.51 chs. dist., monumented with a standard brass cap, 3½ ins. diam., firmly set in a concrete post, 10 ins. diam., extending 6 ins. above ground, with top mkd. SCARE 1953, and a triangle.

Ascend 80 ft. over SE. slope.

- 4.80 Spur, slopes E.; desc. 180 ft. over NE. slope.
- 8.50 Ravine, drains N. 75° E.; asc. 170 ft. over SE. slope.
- 13.00 Spur ridge, bears E. and W.; desc. 435 ft. over N. slope.
- 20.20 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course N. 55° E.; asc. 125 ft. over Se. slope.
- 25.25 Spur, slopes N. 70° E.; desc. 280 fr. over NE. slope.
- 30.00 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course E.; asc. 405 ft. over S. slope.
- 38.87 The cor. of Tps. 20 and 21 S., R. 8 W., monumented with an iron post 3 ins. diam., extending 8 ins. above ground, firmly set, with brass cap marked

28 lks. dist., with no marks remaining.

A fir snag, 55 ins. diam., bears N. 56½° E., 84 lks. dist.,  
with healed blaze.

A fir, 38 ins. diam., bears S. 74° E., 105 lks. dist., with  
fragmentary scribe marks visible on burned face of partly  
healed blaze. (record, 95 lks.)

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky loam.

Timber, scattering fir, hemlock, maple, cedar, and alder; under-  
growth, arrowwood, hazel, vine maple, salal, poison oak, and fern.

N. 1° 23' E., on the W. bdy of sec. 31, T. 20 S., R. 8 W.

Ascend 125 ft. over SE. slope, through heavy burned timber and  
scattering undergrowth.

- 4.20 Ridge, bears SW. and N.; desc. 50 ft. over N. slope, along ridge top.
