

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 21 S., R. 9 W.

## CHAINS

From this point the original closing cor. of secs. 2 and 3, bears N. 0° 09' W., 0.135 chs. dist., monumented with a sandstone, 10 x 8 x 7 ins., firmly set 4 ins. in the ground, mkd. with 2 notches on E. edge, from which the original bearing trees:

A fir snag, 46 ins. diam., bears N 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ \* E., 30 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, N. 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ \* W.)

A fir, 55 ins. diam., bears S. 9\* E., 75 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir snag, 55 ins. diam., bears S. 28\* W., 100 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

From this same point the cor. of secs. 34 and 35 only, T. 20 S., R. 9 W., bears S. 89\* 33' W., 10.67 chs. dist.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, sandy clay loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, and yew; undergrowth, salmonberry, vine maple, thimbleberry, arrowwood, hazel, huckleberry, salal, and fern.

From the cor. of secs. 14, 15, 22, and 23.

N. 85\* 10' W., bet. secs. 15 and 22.

Ascend 425 ft. over broken SE. slope, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

18.30 Knob, on a spur, which slopes S. 30\* W.; asc. 5 ft. along N. slope.

19.835 Point for the E 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 15 and 22.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears N. 36\* E., 42 lks. dist., mkd. E 1/16 S15 BT.

A hemlock, 5 ins. diam., bears S. 29\* W., 26 lks. dist., mkd. E 1/16 S22 BT.

Ascend 35 ft. along N. slope.

23.00 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 565 ft. over SW. slope, changing to NW. slope.

39.67 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 15 and 22, monumented with a sandstone, 14 x 12 x 8 ins., firmly set, 6 ins. in the ground, with no visible marks, from which the original bearing trees:

A maple, 38 ins. diam., bears N. 35\* W., 32 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

The stump hole of a fallen and decayed hemlock, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 26\* W., 54 lks. dist.,
