

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 21 S., R. 9 W.

## CHAINS

N. 47\* E., 75 lks. dist., with scribe marks  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  S visible on opened blaze.

A sawed hemlock stump, 22 ins. diam., bears  
 S. 33 $\frac{1}{2}$ \* W., 15 lks. dist., with scribe mark  
 S visible on opened blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 24 ins.  
 in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which new bearing trees

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 73 $\frac{1}{2}$ \* E., 179 lks.  
 dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S21 BT.

A hemlock, 21 ins. diam., bears S. 10\* E., 242 lks.  
 dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S28 BT.

S. 89\* 20' W., bet secs. 21 and 28.

Descend 5 ft over SW. slope, across logged area through  
 dense undergrowth.

- 1.55 Ravine, drains S.; asc. 370 ft. over SE. slope.  
 10.35 Dirt road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. 30\* E. and S. 30\* W.  
 14.80 Spur, slopes S.; desc. 330 ft. over SW. slope.  
 15.90 Same dirt road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. 15\* W. and  
 S. 15\* E.  
 27.15 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course S.; asc. 170 ft. over SE. slope.  
 40.04 The cor. of secs. 20, 21, 28, and 29.

Land mountainous.

Soil, sandy clay loam.

Timber. scattering fir and hemlock; undergrowth, thimbleberry,  
 huckleberry, arrowwood, elderberry, fir and hemlock reproduction  
 salal and fern.

N. 0\* 34' W., bet secs. 20 and 21.

Ascend 150 ft. over SE. slope, through scattering timber and  
 dense undergrowth.

- 11.95 Ridge, bears E. and W.; desc. 610 ft. over N. slope.  
 32.30 Creek, 8 lks. wide, course E.; asc. 35 ft. over general  
 SE. slope.  
 39.71 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 20 and 21, occupied by the original  
 corner tree, a cedar, 28 ins. diam., with a healed blaze on  
 W. face, from which the original bearing trees:  
 A cedar, 34 ins. diam., bears N. 79 $\frac{1}{2}$ \* E., 22 lks.  
 dist., with healed blaze.  
 A cedar, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 77 $\frac{1}{2}$ \* W., 30 lks. dist., with  
 fragmentary scribe marks visible on open blaze.
