- 20.70 Ravine, drains W.; asc. 115 ft. over SW. slope.
- 23.40 Top of ascent, slopes W.; desc. 110 ft. over NW. slope.
- 27.25 Ravine, drains W.; asc. 130 ft. over SW. slope.
- 31.10 Spur, slopes W.; desc. 165 ft. over NW. slope.
- 37.30 Ravine, drains N. 60\* W.; asc. 5 ft. over SW. slope.
- 38.51 Point for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 16 and 17, at proportionate distance, there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

- 67.80 Spur, slopes W.; desc. 175 ft. over NW. slope changing to W. slope.
- 75.50 Spur, slopes N. 35\* W.; desc. 50 ft. over NE. slope.
- 77.02 The cor. of secs. 8, 9, 16, and 17, monumented with the original sandstone, 16 x 8 x 6 ins., extending 6 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked with 4 grooves on S. and E, faces, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:
