A fir snag, 52 ins. diam., bears N. 70* E.,
18 lks. dist., no marks remaining. (Record
15 lks. and marks reported destroyed by Mensch
in 1910)

A sawed fir stump, 70 ins. diam., bears S. 18* W.,
43 lks. dist., no marks remaining. (Record,
S. 21* W., 40 lks.)

and a bearing tree mkd. by Mensch in 1910

A cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 80* W., 27 $\frac{1}{2}$ lks.
dist., with a healed blaze. (Record, N. 77* W.,
27 lks.)

and a bearing tree mkd. by the County Surveyors Office in 1961

A fir, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 41 $\frac{1}{2}$ * W., 93 lks.
dist., with a healed double blaze.

N. 1* 40' W., beginning measurement.

Ascend 315 ft. over SW. slope, changing to S. slope.

0.60 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 80* W. and SE., on curve.

20.00 Dirt road, 10 lks. wide, bears NW. and S. 10* E.

21.00 Spur, slopes SE.; desc. 15 ft. over NE. slope, changing to
E. slope.

26.30 Ravine, drains SE.; asc. 150 ft. over S. slope.

35.94 From this point, the original 1910 Mensch closing cor. of secs.
6 and 7, T. 26 S., R. 1 W., bears West, 0.17 chs. dist.,
monumented with the original broken basalt stone, 16 x 12 x 6 ins.
firmly set, 12 ins. in the ground, mkd. with 1 groove on N. and 5
grooves on S. face, from which the original bearing trees:

A rotted chinquapin stump, 10 ins. diam., bears
N. 72* E., 44 lks. dist., no marks remaining.

A madrone, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 25* E., 28 lks.
dist., with opened blaze, no scribe marks visible.

The corner falls on a spur, slopes E.

Descend 82 ft. over N. slope.

41.06 The cor. of secs. 1 and 12 only, on the E. bdy. of the Tp.,
perpetuated and recorded by the County Surveyors Office in
1961, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., protruding
12 ins. above the ground, firmly set, with brass cap mkd.
