

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 26 S., R. 7 W

CHAINS

- 22.55 Abandoned dirt road, 15 lks. wide bears N. and S.
- 37.50 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 20 ft. over NW. slope.
- 39.18 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 9 and 16, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
- Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
- T 26 S R 7 W

- from which
- A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears N. $63\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 53 lks. dist.,
 mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S9 BT.
- A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 18° E., 48 lks. dist.,
 mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S16 BT.
- From this point, the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 9 and 16, established by Hathorn in 1855, bears S. $46^{\circ}30'$ W., 0.84 chains dist., determined at record bearing and distance from the remaining original bearing tree:
- A sawed fir stump, 28 ins. diam., bears S. 85° E.,
 35 lks. dist., with scribe mark S visible on bark.
- This 1855 Hathorn corner is superseded by the 1881 Flint survey of the mile bet. secs. 9 and 16.
- Continue along N. slope.
- 40.00 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N. 80° E. and S. 20° W.; asc. 670 ft. over E. slope, changing to NE. slope.
- 46.70 Dirt road, 25 lks. wide, bears N. 30° W. and S. 30° E.
- 59.80 Same dirt road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. 30° W. and S. 30° E.
- 68.80 Bear Ridge, bears N. 20° W. and S. 20° E.; desc. 170 ft. over NW. slope.
- 78.36 The cor. of secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17.
- Land, mountainous.
 Soil, rocky clay with rock outcroppings.
 Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, madrone, alder, maple, yew, and chinquapin; undergrowth, young timber, fern, salal, Oregon grape, ceanothus, poison oak, huckleberry, and salmonberry.

- N. $1^{\circ} 12'$ W., bet. secs. 8 and 9.
- Descend 100 ft. over NW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth, along E. edge of logged area.
- 20.00 Bear Ridge, bears N. 25° W. and S. 25° E.; also dirt road, 20 lks. wide, bears same as ridge; desc. 365 ft. over NE. slope.
