

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Subdivisional Lines, T. 29 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS

- 16.85 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course W.; asc. 450 ft. over general S. slope.
- 39.83 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor. of secs. 15 and 16, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

From this point the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 15 and 16, erroneously reestablished by Thielsen, in 1957, bears South, 0.099 chs. dist., set, marked and witnessed as described in the official record. I remove the iron post, and at the corner point.

Reset the iron post, 36 ins. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

from which bearing trees marked by Thielsen, in 1957

- A fir, 17 ins. diam., bears N. 60 ° E., 68 lks. dist., with healed blaze.
- A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 50° W., 57 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

The corner is located on a spur, slopes SW.; desc. 130 ft. over NW. slope.

- 47.10 Head of ravine, drains S. 70° W.; asc. 190 ft. over SW. slope.
- 57.60 Ridge, bears NW. and SE.; desc. 400 ft. over broken NE. slope.
- 79.66 The cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16, monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, extending 8 ins. above the ground, with brass cap marked and witnessed as described in the official record.

Land, mountainous.
 Soil, rocky clay loam.
 Timber, fir, cedar, pine, oak, maple, madrone, alder, and chinquapin; undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, poison oak, ocean spray, fern, Oregon grape, huckleberry and blackberry.

From the cor. of secs. 21, 22, 27 and 28.

N. 89° 15 ' W., bet. secs. 21 and 28.

Ascend 70 ft. over SE. slope, across logged area, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

- 2.20 Spur, slopes S.; also SE. cor. of old growth timber, edges bear generally N. and W.; desc. 160 ft. over SW. slope, along the N. edge of logged area.
- 8.10 Ravine, drains S. 10° E.; asc. 300 ft. over SE. slope.
- 18.30 Spur, slopes S.; also SW. cor. of old growth timber, edges bear generally N. and E.; desc. 5 ft. along W. slope, across logged area.
