CHAINS

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

From this point, an iron rod, $\frac{1}{2}$ in. diam., firmly set, extending 6 ins. above ground, bears S. 52° W., 0.73 chs. dist.

Ascend 165 ft. over broken SE. slope.

59.73 Point for the N $\frac{1}{16}$ sec. cor. of secs. 20 and 21.

Set a fiberglass post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
