Dependent Resurvey, Portion of N. Bdy., T. 23 S., R. 1 W

CHAINS

- S. $87^{\circ} 57'$ W., beginning new measurement.
- Ascend 305 ft. over broken NE. slope.
- 19.72 Point for the W $1/16$ sec. cor. of secs. 2 and 35, falls on E. edge of dirt road.
- Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., the top 10 ins. below the surface of the road with brass cap mkd.

- A double cedar, 28 ins. diam., bears N. 51° E., 21 lks. dist. mkd. W $1/16$ S 35 BT.
- A cedar, 38 ins. diam., bears S. $9\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 61 lks. dist. mkd. W $1/16$ S 2 BT.
- Ascend 200 ft. over broken NE. slope.
- 19.80 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 10° E. and S. 10° W.
- 39.44 The cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34, and 35, monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, protruding 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap marked and witnessed as described in the record of the 1960 dependent resurvey.
- Land, mountainous.
Soil, rocky clay loam.
Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, chinquapin, yew, dogwood, madrone, pine, and oak; undergrowth, rhododendron, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, huckleberry, wild rose, poison oak, blackberry, salal, Oregon grape, soord fern, and bracken.
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- S. $89^{\circ} 35'$ W., bet. secs. 3 and 34.
- Ascend 205 ft. over E. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
- 5.10 Spur, slopes NE.; desc. 70 ft. over NW. slope.
- 8.60 Creek, 4 lks. wide, course N.; asc. 35 ft. over NE. slope.
- 10.25 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 300 ft. over NW. slope.
- 17.65 Creek, 4 lks. wide, course N.; asc. 220 ft. over E. slope.
- 32.20 Spur ridge, bears N. and S.; desc. 210 ft. over NW. slope.
- 38.40 Ravine, course N.; asc. 10 ft. over E. slope.
- 38.68 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 34, monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, protruding 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap marked and witnessed as described in the record of the dependent resurvey.
- S. $89^{\circ} 56'$ W., beginning new measurement.
- Descend 210 ft. over broken NW. slope.
