Dependent Resurvey, Portion of N. Bdy., T. 23 S., R. 1 W.

CHAINS

- 6.25 Top of ascent, slopes SE.; desc. 15 ft. over SW. slope
- 7.15 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course SE.; asc. 310 ft. over NE. slope.
- 19.44 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 4 and 33, monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, protruding 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap marked and witnessed as described in the record of the 1960 dependent resurvey.

N. $89^{\circ} 56' W.$, beginning new measurement.

Ascend 5 ft. over SE. slope.

- 6.75 Top of ascent, slopes S.; desc. 60 ft. over SW. slope.
- 14.50 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course SE.; asc. 480 ft. over NE. slope.
- 38.90 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. and S.; also enter logged area, edge bears same as road.
- 39.10 The cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32, and 33, monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, 22 ins. in the ground, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.

- A root hole bears N. $55\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E.$, 42 lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, 18 ins. diam., with scribe marks 33 B visible on partially healed blaze.
- A hemlock, 24 ins. diam., bears S. $20^{\circ} E.$, 101 lks. dist. with scribe marks 4 RLW B visible on partially healed blaze.
- A sawed hemlock stump, 16 ins. diam., bears S. $49^{\circ} W.$, 75 lks. dist., with scribe mark T visible on partially healed blaze.
- A sawed hemlock stump, 22 ins. diam., bears N. $58^{\circ} W.$, 51 lks. dist., with scribe marks S32 S RLW BT visible on partially healed blaze.

and a new bearing tree

- A fir, 72 ins. diam., bears N. $53^{\circ} E.$, 113 lks. dist. mkd. T22S RLW S33 BT.
