

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 23 S., R. 1 W.

CHAINS	From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11, and 12, monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, protruding 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap marked and witnessed as described in the record of the 1960 dependent resurvey.
	N. 2° 11' W., bet. secs. 1 and 2, marking and blazing the true line.
	Descend 290 ft. over NW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
20.44	The S 1/16 sec.cor. of secs. 1 and 2, determined at record bearing and distance from the original bearing trees:
	A hemlock, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 5½° E., 34 lks. dist., with scribe marks S1/16 S1 BT visible on partially healed blaze.
	A cedar, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 48½° W., 59 lks. dist. with scribe marks S1/16 S2 BT visible on partially healed blaze.
	At the corner point
	Set an iron post, 12 ins. long, 1 in. diam., 5 ins. in drill hole, in solid rock, with brass cap mkd.
	S 1/16 S 2 S 1 1966
	The corner is located on S. edge of Walker Creek, 20 lks. wide, course NE.
	N. 2° 04' W., beginning new measurement.
	Thence across creek and ascend 160 ft. over SE. slope.
20.35	The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 2, monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, protruding 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap marked and witnessed as described in the record of the 1960 dependent resurvey.
	N. 2° 43' W., beginning new measurement.
	Ascend 10 ft. over SE. slope.
1.50	Spur, slopes E.; desc. 195 ft. over NE. slope.
20.50	Sharps Creek Road, 30 lks. wide, bears NW. and SE.
27.30	Sharps Creek, 30 lks. wide, course NW.; asc. 385 ft. over SW. slope.
41.04	The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35, and 36, on the N. bdy. of the Tp.
	Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, alder, maple, dogwood, yew, cascara, madrone, chinquapin, pine, and oak; undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, rhododendron, huckleberry, blackberry, wild rose, salal, Oregon grape, poison oak, sword and bracken fern.
