Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 23 S., R. 1 W.

CHAINS

with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, protruding 2 ins. above a mound of stone, with brass cap marked and witnessed as described in the record of the 1960 dependent resurvey.

N. $3^{\circ} 53'$ W., bet. secs. 10 and 11.

Descend 635 ft. over general NE. slope, through heavy timber and moderate undergrowth.

Point for the S $\frac{1}{16}$ sec. cor. of secs. 10 and 11.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

The corner point is located on a spur, slopes N. 15° W.

Descend 550 ft. over NE. slope.

Walker Creek, 10 lks. wide, course E.; asc. 240 ft. over SW. slope.

Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 10 and 11, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Spur, slopes S. 30° W.; desc. 20 ft. over NW. slope.

Ravine, drains S. 70° W.; asc. 145 ft. over SW. slope.

Spur, slopes S. 30° E.; asc. 170 ft. over SE. slope.

Point for the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10, and 11, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
