	<p>A hemlock, 15 ins, diam., bears N. 27° W., 33 lks. dist. with healed blaze.</p> <p>and a tree by Corbin, in 1960</p> <p>A root hole bears N. 74° E., 11 lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, 7 ins. diam., with scribe marks T23S RLW S15 BT visible on partially healed blaze.</p> <p>and new bearing trees</p> <p>A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 69° E., 36 lks. dist., mkd. T23 S RLW S15 BT.</p> <p>A hemlock, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 47<math>\frac{1}{4}</math>° W., 40 lks. dist., mkd. T23S RLW S21 BT.</p> <p>Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, chinquapin, yew, cascara, dogwood, madrone, pine, and oak; undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, rhododendron, huckleberry, blackberry, wild rose, Oregon grape, salal, poison oak, sword fern and bracken.</p>
	<p>N. 3° 20' W., bet. secs. 9 and 10.</p> <p>Descend 495 ft. over general N. slope, through heavy timber and light undergrowth.</p>
