

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 23 S., R. 1 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 60° E., 136 lks. dist., with scribe marks T23S R1W S8 CS BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A fir, 35 ins. diam., bears S. $1\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., $35\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., with scribe marks T23S R1W S7 CS BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A cedar, 30 ins. diam., bears N. $62\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 146 lks. dist., with scribe marks T23S R1W S6 CS BT visible on open blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground to bedrock, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.

Reset the iron pipe alongside the iron post.

From this point the cor. of secs. 17, 18, 19, and 20, bears S. $1^{\circ} 51'$ W., 155.03 chs. dist., determined at record bearing and distance from the remains of the original bearing trees:

A cedar snag, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 37° E., 11 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A sawed cedar stump, 34 ins. diam., bears S. 53° W., 53 lks. dist., with scribe marks 19 visible on partially healed blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.

A cedar, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 12° E., 50 lks. dist., mkd. T23S R1W S20 BT

A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears S. $60\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ W., $171\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., mkd. T23S R1W S19 BT.

A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears N. $86\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ W., $14\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist. mkd. T23S R1W S18 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, yew cascara, maple, alder, dogwood, madrone, and pine; undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, rhododendron, wild rose, salal, Oregon grape, poison oak, sword fern and bracken.
