

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Portion Subdivisional Lines, T. 30 S., R. 6 W.

CHAINS

Ascend 300 ft. over S. slope, across logged area.

18.20 Langell Ridge, bears N. 55° E. and W.; also dirt road, 10 lks. wide, bears the same; desc. 330 ft. over NW. slope.

34.30 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course N. 30° W.; desc. 190 ft. over steep NW. slope.

39.35 Point for the cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9, and 10, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 26 ins. diam., bears N. 13½° E., 67½ lks. dist., mkd. T30S R6W S3 BT.

A fir, 53 ins. diam., bears S. 82° E., 121 lks. dist., mkd. T30S R6W S10 BT.

A white fir, 4 ins. diam., bears S. 11 ¾° W., 21 lks. dist., mkd. X at breast height and BT at base.

A white fir, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 65¼° W., 130 lks. dist, mkd. T30S R6W S4 BT.

An iron pipe of which I have no record, 1 ins. diam., protruding 12 ins. above the ground, firmly set, bears S. 31 ¾° E., 55 lks. dist.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, pine, yew, maple, and madrone; undergrowth, salal, fern, poison oak, blackberry, vine maple, and reproduction.

From the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 10, perpetuated and recorded by John H. Markham, Jr., Registered Engineer No. 2880, in 1957, again perpetuated and recorded by J. W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1963, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., protruding 10 ins. above the ground, firmly set, with brass cap mkd.
