

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Portion Subdivisional Lines, T. 30 S., R. 6 W.

## CHAINS

A shattered fir stump, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 36° E., 57½ lks. dist., with scribe marks  $\frac{1}{4}$  S3 BT visible on open blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 37 ins. diam., bears N. 13° W., 51 lks. dist. with no marks visible.

and a new bearing tree

A cedar, 4 ins. diam., bears N. 73° W., 61 lks. dist., mkd. X at breast height and BT at base.

No live tree available within limits in sec. 10.

S. 89° 56' W., bet. secs. 3 and 10.

Descend 60 ft. over NW. slope, across logged area.

3.50 Ravine, drains N. 10° W.; asc. 13 ft. over NE. slope.

4.50 Top of ascent, slopes N.; desc. 190 ft. over NW. slope.

13.60 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N. 20° E.; asc. 135 ft. over NE. slope.

20.70 Spur, slopes N. 35° E.; desc. 260 ft. over NW. slope.

26.50 Leave logged area, edge bears N. 20° W. and S. 20° E.; enter timber.

34.15 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N.; asc. 10 ft. over NE. slope.

35.40 Top of ascent, slopes N.; desc. 50 ft. over steep NW. slope.

38.91 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9, and 10.

Land, mountainous.  
soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, yew, and madrone; undergrowth, salal, fern, blackberry, vine maple, poison oak, and reproduction.

N. 2° 12' E., bet. secs. 3 and 4.

Descend 25 ft. over steep N. slope, through heavy timber and moderate undergrowth.

0.30 Judd Creek, 3 lks. wide, course N. 50° E.; asc. 205 ft. over SE. slope.

11.50 Spur, slopes NE.; desc. 130 ft. over NE. slope.

14.00 Leave timber, edge bears E. and W.; enter logged area.

23.50 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course NE.; continue along broken E. slope.

39.37 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 4, perpetuated and recorded by John H. Markham, Jr., Registered Engineer No. 2880, in 1952, from bearing trees of which I have no record, monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., protruding 8 ins. above the ground, firmly set. This corner is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

from which bearing trees reported by <sup>M</sup>arkham:

A fir, 25 ins. diam., bears S. 62½° E., 13 lks. dist., with no scribe marks visible on opened blaze. This tree remarked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S BT on the bark by Markham in 1952.
