

Dependent Resurvey, Portion Subdivisional Lines, T. 30 S., R. 6 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 79° W., 22½ lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S16 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, pine, cedar, madrone, and oak; undergrowth, salal, fern, poison oak, and reproduction.

From the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 8 and 9, perpetuated and recorded by John H. Markham, Registered Engineer, No. 2880, in 1955, monumented with a steel shaft, 1¼ ins. diam., protruding 12 ins. above the ground, firmly set, from which the remaining original bearing tree:

A cedar, 45 ins. diam., bears N. 20° E., 30 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on opened and weathered blaze.

and a tree described by Markham in 1955

A pine, 46 ins. diam., bears N. 17° W., 185 lks. dist., with scribe marks  $\frac{1}{4}$  S visible on opened blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

from which a new bearing tree

A twin fir, 37 ins. diam., bears N. 31¼° E., 69 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S9 BT.

Reset the steel shaft alongside the iron post.

N. 0° 42' W., bet. secs. 8 and 9.

Descend 70 ft. over NW. slope, through heavy timber and light undergrowth.

- 11.00 Bottom of descent, slopes SW.; asc. 110 ft. over S. slope, changing to SW. slope, across rocky barren.
- 17.20 Spur, slopes SW.; asc. 10 ft. along W. slope.
- 24.00 Main ridge of Nickel Mountain, bears North and S. 15° E.; asc. 10 ft. along ridge .
- 29.30 Leave ridge, bears N. 15° W. and South, enter timber, edge bears SW. and E.; also junction of spur, slopes E.; desc. 50 ft. over NE. slope.
- 34.65 Bottom of descent, slopes NE.; asc. 12 ft. along E. slope.
- 37.00 Leave timber, edge bears N. 80° E. and S. 20° W.; enter rocky barren.
- 40.16 The cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8, and 9, monumented with the original mound of stone, now scattered, located at intersection of faces of four bearing trees of which I have no record:
