

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Portion Subdivisional Lines, T. 30 S., R. 6 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 47 ins. diam., bears N. 2° E., 168 lks. dist., with scribe marks S4 visible on opened blaze.

A fir, 60 ins. diam., bears S. 5¼° E., 396 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

A fir, 41 ins. diam., bears S. 69½° W., 330 lks. dist., with scribe marks T30S R6W S8 visible on opened blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 55 ins. diam., bears N. 2 3/4° W., 117 lks. dist., with scribe marks R6W visible on opened blaze.

A count of the growth rings on the three opened trees gives an average age for the blazes of 106 years.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 8 ins. in the ground to solid rock, supported in a mound of stone, 5 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.

From this point a locally established cor., bears N. 6½° E., 0.81 chs. dist., perpetuated and recorded by John H. Markham, Jr., Registered Engineer No. 2880, in 1951, The cor. is located at cor. of old rail fences extending N. and E.; monumented with an unmarked stone alongside of which is an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., protruding 10 ins. above ground, firmly set, from which bearing trees mkd. by Markham:

A fir, 55 ins. diam., bears N. 6 3/4° E., 70 lks. dist., mkd. T30S R6W. S4 BT on bark blaze.

A fir, 25 ins. diam., bears N. 24½° E., 117 lks. dist., mkd. with a healed double blaze.

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 53° W., 98 lks. dist., mkd. with a healed blaze.

The corner falls in a rocky barren.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, pine, madrone, oak, maple, and cedar; undergrowth, fern, salal, poison oak, and reproduction.

From the cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9, and 10.

N. 89° 21' W., bet. secs. 4 and 9.

Descend 30 ft. over steep NW. slope, across partially logged area, through scattering timber and light undergrowth.

1.50 Judd Creek, 3 lks. wide, course N. 75° E. from W.; asc. 50 ft. over E. slope along creek.

7.00 Leave creek, drains from SW.; asc. 285 ft. over steep rocky E. slope.
