

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Portion Subdivisional Lines, T. 30 S., R. 6 W.

CHAINS

Land, mountainous.  
 Soil, rocky clay.  
 Timber, fir, oak, madrone, yew, cedar, and pine; undergrowth,  
 fern, salal, poison oak, blackberry, and reproduction.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lines resurveyed are located between Nickel Mountain, Boomer Hill, and Lane Creek about 3 miles northwest of Riddle, Oregon. The elevation ranges from about 1,560 feet to 3,200 feet above sea level. The soil is a rocky clay with a few rock outcroppings. Dirt and gravelled roads lead to numerous abandoned logging operations throughout the area. No occupied dwellings were noted along the lines resurveyed. Several ranches were noted in the area with cattle raising being the chief activith.

Timber consists chiefly of fir, madrone, oak, pine, cedar, yew, dogwood, maple, and chinquapin. Undergrowth is chiefly fern, salal, poison oak, vine maple, Oregon grape, blackberry, wild rose, nettle, and reproduction.

Outcroppings of nickel ore were noted along the ridge between Nickel Mountain and Boomer Hill. Open pit mining was noted in in section 17.

A number of readings along the lines resurveyed gives a mean magnetic declination of 19° 00' East. There is a range of 3° 30' in local attraction.
