Ives and G. W. Hyde in 1854, perpetuated and recorded by the  
Douglas County Surveyors Office, in 1957, monumented with an iron  
post, 1 in. diam., protruding 12 ins. above ground, firmly set,  
with brass cap mkd.

A burned fir stump, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 34° E., 4 lks.  
dist., with scribe mark T visible on rotted blaze.

A burned fir stump, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 60° E., 17  
lks. dist., with scribe marks R T31S S BT visible in  
reverse on overgrowth lying on ground.

and bearing trees mkd. by the County Surveyors Office in 1957.

A fir, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 18° E., 28 lks. dist.,  
with a healed double blaze.

A live oak, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 29° W., 48 lks. dist.,  
with a healed double blaze.

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 7° W., 43 lks. dist.,  
with a healed double blaze.

Add marks BLM 1966 to brass cap.

N. 89° 00' W., along the N. bdy. of sec. 1, marking and blazing  
the true line.

Descend 250 ft. over broken SW. slope, through heavy timber and  
dense undergrowth.

13.30 O'Shea Creek, 15 lks. wide, course N. 60° W.; asc. 450 ft. over NE.  
slope.

25.50 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 90 ft. over NW. slope.

29.00 Ravine, drains N.; asc. 245 ft. over NE. slope.

37.66 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 1 only, on the N. bdy. of the Tp.,  
established by Byars in 1882, perpetuated and recorded by J. W.  
Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1963, monumented with an iron  
rod,  $\frac{1}{2}$  in. diam., protruding 6 ins. above ground, firmly set, from  
which the original bearing trees:
