From the cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35, and 36, monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., protruding 8 ins. above ground, firmly set, with brass cap mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record of a 1955 resurvey.

S. 89° 45' W., bet. secs. 26 and 35.

Ascend 115 ft. over NE. slope through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

7.00 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 370 ft. over NW. slope.

22.10 Interstate Highway No. 5 (formerly Pacific Highway) bears N. and S.; desc. 10 ft. over W. slope.

25.50 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course N.; asc. 600 ft. over E. slope.

39.66 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 26 and 35, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 36 ins. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 32° E., 36 lks. dist.,

A fir, 25 ins. diam., bears S. 14° W., 64 lks. dist.,
mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S35 BT.

Deposit broken hand axe head at base of iron post.

From this point, the point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 26 and 35, established in 1955, bears N. 18° 47' W., 0.525 chs. dist.
Destroyed all marks on the 1955 bearing trees.

Ascend 45 ft. over E. slope.

41.75 Ridge, bears N. 30° E. and S. 30° W.; desc. 815 ft. over NW. slope.

61.60 Creek, 10 lks. wide, course N. 20° E.; asc. 645 ft. over SE. slope.

79.32 The cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34, and 35.
