80.10 Spring seepage, 2 lks. wide, course W.; asc. 1 ft. along W. slope.

80.16 The cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35, and 36, perpetuated and recorded by B. B. Irving, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1923, when an original bearing tree was existent; again perpetuated and recorded by J. W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1963, monumented with an iron post 1 in. diam., protruding 12 ins. above ground, firmly set, with brass cap mkd.

A sawed fir stump, 11 ins. diam., bears N. 30° E., 39 lks. dist., with no marks visible.

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 66½° E., 102 lks. dist., with scribe mark 3 visible on open double blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 25 ins. diam., bears S. 12° W., 38 lks. dist., with no marks visible.

and bearing trees mkd. by Byron in 1963

A white oak, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 30¼° E., 104 lks. dist., with scribe marks S36 T30S R5W CS BT visible on open blaze.

An alder, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 32° E., 28 lks. dist., with scribe marks S36 CS BT visible on open double blaze.

A fir, 23 ins. diam., bears S. 10° W., 85 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

A black oak, 19 ins. diam., bears N. 24½° W., 51 lks. dist., with scribe marks S26 T30S R5W CS BT visible on open double blaze.

The cor. falls in a wire fence line. bears N. 70° E. and S. 70° W.

Land, mountainous except for narrow creek bottom.
 Soil, rocky clay with rock outcroppings.
 Timber, fir, oak, madrone, maple, alder, cedar, myrtle, dogwood, chinquapin, and pine; undergrowth, vine maple, poison oak, fern, salal, hazel, arrowwood, blackberry, Oregon grape, nettle, and reproduction.

N. 88° 39' W., bet. secs. 26 and 35.

Descend 175 ft. over W. slope, across partially logged area, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

14.60 Gravelled road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 35° W. and SE.

15.00 O'Shea Creek, 15 lks. wide, course N. 60° W.; asc. 100 ft. over NE. slope changing to N. slope.
