## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Section 7, township 22 south, range 7 west, is located about 2 miles north of Elkton, Oregon. Access to the area is by way of a privately owned graveled road. The area is drained by a number of small streams which are tri utaries of the Umpqua River. Elevations range from about 240 feet above sea level on the east boundary of section 7, to about 1,280 feet above sea level near the  $\frac{1}{4}$  section corner of sections 6 and 7.

The southwestern portion of the section is used to pasture cattle. Most of the remaining portion of the section is forested with fir, hemlock, white fir, cedar, yew, maple, alder, dogwood, madrone, cascara, and chinquapin timber, with undergrowth of hazel, arrowwood, huckleberry, vine maple, ceanothus, poison oak, salmon-berry, elderberry, Oregon grape salal, Scotch vroom, rhododendron, blackberry, thimbleberry, and fern.

No evidence of mineral was noted in the course of the resurvey.
