True point for the closing cor. of secs. 3 and 4, hereinafter described:

From this point the cor. of secs. 33 and 34 only, T. 22 S., R. 8 W., bears N. 87° 42' W., 2.76 chs. dist., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 5 ins. above ground, with brass cap, marked and witnessed as described in the official record of the 1962 resurvey.

Land, mountainous.
Soil, sandy clay loam.
Timber, fir, hemlock, maple, cedar, myrtle, alder, oak, and willow;
Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, thimbleberry, poison oak, huckleberry, blackberry, ceanothus, wild rose, Scotch broom, Oregon grape, salal, and fern.

From the ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 13 only, on the W. bdy. of sec. 13, perpetuated and recorded by Vernon Tracey, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1967, monumented with an iron post, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, with brass cap marked

From which the original bearing trees

A madrone, 25 ins. diam., bears S. 65° E., 9 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on opened blaze.

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 79° W., 65 lks. dist., with no marks visible on opened and rotted blaze.

and bearing trees marked by Tracey

A madrone, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 59° E., 56 lks. dist., with scribe marks ¼ S13 CS BT visible on open double blaze.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 25° W., 49 lks. dist., with scribe marks ¼ S14 CS BT visible on open double blaze.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 83° W., 16 lks. dist., with scribe marks ¼ S14 CS BT visible on open double blaze.

Add marks BLM 1967 to brass cap.

N. 0° 10' E., along the W. bdy. of sec. 13, marking and blazing the true line.

Descend 305 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
