

Dependent Resurvey, 7th Stan. Par. S., Portion of S. Bdy., T. 32 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS

A sawed fir stump, 32 ins. diam., bears S. 10° E., 19 lks. dist., with opened and rotted blaze. There are illegible scribe marks visible on bark blaze alongside rotted blaze. (Record, S. 10° W., 23 lks.)

The rotted remains of a fir stump, size indeterminate, bears N. 46° W., 37 lks. dist., with no marks visible.

and bearing trees mkd. by Larson

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 32° E., 23 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A live oak, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 1° E., 48½ lks. dist., with scribe marks 3642 BT visible on open blaze.

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 33° W., 27 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Insert iron pipe inside iron post.

Land, east half mile level bottom land, west half mile mountainous. Soil, sandy loam and rocky clay.

Timber, fir, pine, cedar, madrone, oak, ash, alder, maple, and chinquapin; undergrowth, vie maple, white thorn, ceanothus, manzanita, devil's club, and poison oak.

T. 33 S., R. 7 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

(Restoring the 1855 survey by Wells Lake and George
W. Hyde, and the 1963 resurvey by Joseph S. Gawron)

Beginning at the cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap marked and witnessed as described in the official record of the 1963-64 remonumentation.

N. 0° 12' E., bet. secs. 13 and 18, marking and blazing the true line.

Ascend 135 ft. over SW. slope, along W. edge of logged area.

- 8.20 Ravine, drains S. 15° W.; asc. 240 ft. over SE. slope.
- 22.25 Ridge, bears N. 80° E. and S. 80° W.; also dirt road, 10 lks. wide, bears same as ridge; desc. 85 ft. over NE. slope.
- 40.25 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 13 and 18, monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap marked and witnessed as described in the official record of the 1963 dependent resurvey.
