

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of E. Boundary, T. 33 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS

- 19.28 Paved road, 40 lks. wide, bears N. 70° W. and S. 70° E.
- 19.81 The witness corner to the standard corner of Tps. 33 S., Rs. 6 and 7 W., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap, mkd. and witnessed as described in official record of the 1963 resurvey.

Descend 10 ft. over N. slope.
- 20.10 Left bank of Cow Creek, bears N. 80° E. and S. 80° W., course S. 80° W.
- 20.39 True point for the standard cor. of Tps. 33 S., Rs. 6 and 7 W., in Cow Creek, as described in the official record of a 1963-64 resurvey.

Land, mountainous.
Soil, rocky clay.
Timber, fir, pine, cedar, madrone, oak, alder, and chinquapin; undergrowth, vine maple, whitethorn, ceanothus, mansanita, devil's club, and poison oak.

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the S. Bdy.,
T. 33 S., R. 7 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

(Restoring the 1882 survey by William H. Byars)

From the true point for the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32, and 33, determined at record bearing and distance from the witness cor., which is monumented with an ironpost, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record of a 1957 dependent resurvey.

N. 89° 43' W., bet. secs. 5 and 32, marking and blazing the true line.

Descend 30 ft. over SW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth, across placer mine.

- 0.75 Bottom of mining cut bank, bears N. 50° W. and S. 50° E.; desc. 380 ft. over SW. slope.
- 3.45 Leave placer mine, edge bears N. 35° W. and S. 35° E.
- 14.70 McKnabe Creek, 20 lks. wide, course N. 50° W.; asc. 45 ft. over NE. slope.
- 15.70 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 70 ft. over NW. slope.
- 19.345 Point for the witness cor. for the E 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 32.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground, to solid rock, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.
