

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 33 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS

Descend 585 ft. over NW. slope.

38.64 The cor. of secs. 11, 12, 13 and 14, perpetuated and recorded by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1963, monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 14 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

from which the original bearing trees

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 25° E., 23½ lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on burned bark blaze. This tree remarked by County Surveyor. No marks visible on pitched over blaze. (Record, 21 lks.)

A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears S. 73° E., 18½ lks. dist., with scribe marks T33S visible on bark blaze. This tree remarked by County Surveyor. No marks visible on pitched-over blaze. (Record, S. 72° E., 20 lks.)

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 42° W., 16 lks. dist., no marks visible. This tree remarked by County Surveyor. Blaze healed.

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 46° W., 43½ lks. dist., with scribe marks S11 visible on open blaze. (Record, 42 lks.)

I add marks HLM 1969 to brass cap.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam.

Timber, fir, cedar, chinquapin, maple, alder, oak, pine, madrone; undergrowth, devil's club, manzanita, ceanothus, whitethorn, poison oak, and vine maple.

From the cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13, and 18 on the E. bdy. of the Tp.

S. 80° 22' W., bet. secs. 12 and 13.

Descend 565 ft. over NW. slope, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

23.30 Creek, 4 lks. wide, course S.30° W.; asc. 35 ft. over SE. slope.

26.10 Top of ascent, slopes S.; desc. 120 ft. over SW. slope.

36.95 Dirt road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. 20° W. and S. 40° E.

40.40 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 12 and 13, perpetuated and recorded by Thomas H. Mehl, Registered Land Surveyor, No. 749, in 1967, monumented with an iron pipe, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, from which the remaining original bearing tree:

A decayed pine stump, 48 ins. diam., bears N. 18° E., 70 lks. dist., with no marks visible. (Record, a fir)

and bearing trees mkd. by Mehl
