CHAINS

- 1.45 Mehl Creek, 15 lks. wide, course N. 15° W.; asc. 305 ft. over SE. slope.
- 19.50 Spur, slopes S.; desc. 225 ft. over SW. slope.
- 25.90 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course S. 60° E.; asc. 390 ft. over E. slope.
- 37.00 Spur, slopes S.; desc. 45 ft. over SW. slope.
- 40.795 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 13 and 24, perpetuated and recorded by the County Surveyor in 1967, monumented with an iron post, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

- A fir stump, 36 ins. diam., bears S. 64° W., 50 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially open blaze.

and trees mkd. by the County Surveyor

- A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 30 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° E., 55 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially open blaze.
- A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 26 $\frac{3}{4}$ ° W., 117 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially open blaze.

S. 89° 33' W., beginning new measurement.

Descend 120 ft. over W. slope.

- 2.95 Ravine, drains S. 60° W.; asc. 20 ft. over SE. slope
- 5.90 Spur, slopes S.; desc. 110 ft. over SW. slope.
- 15.40 Spur ridge, bears N. 10° W.; and S. 10° E.; desc. 230 ft. over W. slope.
- 28.20 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course S. 60° E.; asc. 400 ft. over E. slope.
- 38.20 Spur ridge, bears NW. and SE.; desc. 10 ft. over SW. slope.
- 40.21 The cor. of secs. 13, 14, 23, and 24, perpetuated and recorded by the County Surveyor in 1960, monumented with an iron post, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.
