A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° W., 108 lks. dist.,
mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S2 BT.

Ascend 170 ft. over broken E. slope.

48.00 Ridge, bears N. and S.; desc. 345 ft. over SW. slope

51.60 Jeep road, 10 lks. wide, bears N. and S.

61.20 Ravine, drains S. 40° W.; asc. 45 ft. over SE. slope.

69.45 Spur ridge, bears N. 60° E. and S. 60° W., and jeep road,
10 lks. wide, bears same as spur ridge; desc. 85 ft. over
NW. slope.

with scribe marks T31S R7W S2 CS BT visible
on open blaze.

A pine, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° W., 71 lks. dist.,
with scribe marks 31 CS visible on open blaze.
