Remonumentation of an Original Corner Point, T. 31 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.  $36\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  E., 104 lks. dist., mkd. T31S R7W S13 BT.

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.  $83\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  W., 118 lks. dist., mkd. T31S R7W S14 BT.

Reset iron pipe alongside iron post.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

That portion of township 31 south, range 7 west, Willamette Meridian, Oregon, covered by this resurvey is located about 10 miles southwesterly from Canyonville, Oregon. The area is broken and mountainous with elevations ranging from about 800 feet above sea level to 2,960 feet above sea level. The area is drained by Island Creek, Iron Mountain Creek, and Cow Creek and their tributaries. Soil is a rocky clay loam. The area is forested with fir, hemlock, pine, alder, oak, and cedar with undergrowth of vine maple, fern, Oregon grape, hazel, poison oak, and salal.

Access is gained by way of a paved road from Canyonville and a number of logging roads extending from it into the area.

There were no mineral deposits noted in the area.

The average of a considerable number of readings over all parts of the area resurveyed gives a value of  $18^{\circ} 22'$  E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of  $1^{\circ} 57'$  in local attraction.
