

# County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon 14532

Dependent Resurvey, Subdivisional Lines, T. 31 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

A fir stump, 25 ins. diam., bears West, 14 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on open blaze. (Record S. 88° W., 13 lks.)

and bearing trees mkd. by Powell

A fir, 19 ins. diam., bears S. 59 3/4° E., 67 lks. dist., with scribe marks 1/4 S14 CS visible on partially healed blaze.

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 7 1/4° W., 42 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze.

N. 89° 58' W., between secs. 11 and 14.

Descend 55 ft. over NW. slope, through cleared area.

11.70 Bottom of descent, slopes N.; asc. 150 ft. over NE. slope.

20.30 Point for the W 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 11 and 14.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 22° W., 72 1/2 lks. dist., mkd. W 1/16 S11 BT.

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 36° E., 51 lks. dist., mkd. W 1/16 S14 BT.

Ascend 95 ft. over E. slope, along S. edge of timber.

26.00 Spur ridge, bears N. 15° W. and S. 15° E., slopes S. 15° E. to saddle; desc. 250 ft. over W. slope.

37.30 Drew Creek, 10 lks. wide, course N.; asc. 80 ft. over NE. slope. Enter cultivated field, edge bears N. and S.

40.60 The cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14, and 15, perpetuated by H. L. Epstein, County Surveyor, in 1928, from original bearing trees which are no longer in existence, determined at record bearing and distance from the remaining bearing trees mkd. by Epstein:

A fir stump, 36 ins. diam., bears N. 22° E., 51 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on open and rotted blaze.

A fir stump, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 80° E., 59 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A cedar, 11 ins. diam., with scribe marks CS visible on partially healed blaze, is lying alongside cor.; tree has been displaced by logging operations and its original position is indeterminate.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 21 ins. in the ground, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.
