CHAINS

12.105 The closing corner of Tps. 23 S., Rs. 9 and 10 W., determined and recorded by the Oregon State Board of Forestry in 1968, monumented with an iron post, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, level with the surface of the ground, with brass cap mkd.

- A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears N. 75° E., 44 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on open blaze.
- A fir, 45 ins. diam., bears S. 31½° W., 22 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on open blaze.

Ascen 565 ft. over broken NE. slope.

36.30 Ridge, divides Camp Creek drainage and Sock Creek drainage, bears N. 15° W., and S. 15° E.; desc. 95 ft. over broken SW. slope.

38.605 The cor. of Tps. 22 S., Rgs. 9 and 10 W., perpetuated and recorded by the Oregon State Board of Forestry in 1967, monumented with the original basalt stone, 16 x 14 x 6 ins., firmly set, 10 ins. in ground, no marks visible, alongside of which is an iron post, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground with brass cap mkd.

- A fir, 19 ins. diam., bears N. 71½° E., 31 lks. dist. with fragmentary scribe marks visible on open blaze
- A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears N. 22¼° W., 37½ lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on open blaze.

Land, mountainous.  
 Soil, clay loam.  
 Timber, fir, hemlock, oak, maple, cedar, and dogwood; undergrowth, poison oak, hazel, salal, fern, and arrowwood.

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the East Boundary,

From the cor. of secs. 1 and 12 only, perpetuated and recorded by the County Surveyor in 1952, monumented with the point of a wooden stake, 18 ins. below the surface of ground, from which the remaining original bearing tree:

- A laurel, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 20° W., 45 lks. dist., with healed blaze.
