

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 27 S., R. 1 W.

CHAINS

Land, mountainous.  
Soil, rocky clay and loam.  
Timber, fir, hemlock, and pine; undergrowth; willow, Oregon grape and rhododendron.

From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11, and 12.

N. 89° 56' W., bet. secs. 2 and 11.

Descend 15 ft. over SW. slope, through heavy timber and light undergrowth.

- 2.60 Ravine, drains S.; asc. 55 ft. over SE. slope.
- 19.60 Spur, slopes S.; desc. 295 ft. over NW. slope.
- 39.15 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 60° W. and S. 60° E.
- 39.84 Point for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 2 and 11, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.  
  
Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears S. 27  $\frac{3}{4}$ ° W., 58 lks. dist.,  
mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S11 BT.

A pine, 33 ins. diam., bears N. 66 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., 43 lks. dist.,  
mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S2 BT.

- 41.60 Lookout Mountain Road, gravelled, 30 lks. wide, bears N. 45° E. and S. 45° W.; desc. 30 ft. over NW. slope.
- 43.80 Enter marsh and dense willows, edge bears N. 45° E. and S. 45° W.
- 47.80 Leave marsh, edge bears N. 45° E. and S. 60° W.; asc. 5 ft. over SE. slope.
- 48.50 Point of spur, slopes S.; desc. 10 ft. over SW. slope.
- 50.65 Emile Creek, 8 lks. wide, course N. 60° W.; asc. 65 ft. over NE. slope.
- 51.30 Lookout Mountain Road, gravelled, 30 lks. wide, bears N. 60° W. and S. 60° E.; continue ascent.
- 55.70 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 90 ft. over NW. slope.
- 74.10 Enter open meadow, edge bears N. 30° E. and S. 30° W.
- 77.80 Enter heavy timber, edge bears N. and S.; asc. 2 ft. along gentle N. slope.
- 79.68 The cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10, 11, perpetuated by the Douglas County Surveyor, in 1969, with an iron pipe,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., firmly set, protruding 13 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd.
