CHAINS

A fir stump, 19 ins. diam., bears S. 1° W., 11 lks. dist., no marks visible.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 16 ins. in the ground, and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.

Timber, fir, pine and hemlock; undergrowth, vine maple, salal, huckleberry and rhododendron.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Township 27 south, Range 1 West, is located approximately 17 miles East of the small town of Glide, Oregon, and about 4 miles East of the Wolf Creek Job Corps Center. The area is accessible via the Little River road in Glide, Oregon. The land in the portion of the township resurveyed under this assignment is mountainous and varies in elevation from 1450 to 4500 ft. above sea level. The soil is generally a rocky clay loam. Timber consists of Douglas and white fir, pine, cedar and hemlock. Undergrowth consists of willow, rhododendron, salal, vine maple, and huckleberry. The north boundary is drained by Emile Creek, and the remainder by the Little River drainage. Most of this area is well suited for timber due to the steep terrain, and much of the private land has been logged.

No minerals or mining activity were noted in the area.
