CHAINS

- 27.10 Top of ascent, slopes S.; desc. 40 ft. over W. slope.
- 28.43 From this point, the SE. cor. of a wood frame dwelling bears S. 11 lks. dist., dimensions 24 x 24 ft., sides bear N. and W.
- 30.00 Little River, 1 ch. wide, course N. 45° W.; asc. 30 ft. over nearly level ground.
- 40.13 The center S 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 8.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

That portion of township 27 south, range 2 west, pertaining to this resurvey is located about 25 miles easterly from the city of Roseburg, Oregon. Access is gained via Oregon State Highway 130 and Little River Road branching off from it. The section is predominately mountainous and is drained by Little River and one of its tributaries, Greenman Creek. Elevations range from about 1,050 feet above sea level, in the middle of section 8, to about 2,000 feet above sea level near the northwestern corner of section 8.

Soil in this area consists of rock and clay loam which supports a luxuriant growth of timber, consisting primarily of Douglas fir with stands of hemlock, cedar, madrone, maple, pine, and chinquapin. The undergrowth consists of fern, vine maple, ceanothus, hazel, rhododendron, and poison oak. No indication of minerals was noted.

The average of a considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 19° 55' E., for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 2° in local attraction.
