- 7.25 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N.; asc. 105 ft. over NE. slope.
- 17.90 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 470 ft. over W. slope.
- 26.30 Creek. 1 lk. wide, course N. 40° W.; desc. 60 ft. over NW. slope.
- 39.30 Paved road, 50 lks. wide, bears NE. and SW.
- 39.84 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 12 and 13, perpetuated and recorded by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1964, monumented with an iron post, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, protruding 3 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A sawed fir stump, 48 ins. diam., bears N. 70° W.,

A maple, 11 ins. diam., bears N. 77½° W., 38 lks. dist.,
 mkd. ¼ S12 CS BT on double blaze.

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 75½° W., 93 lks. dist.,
 with a partially healed double blaze.

N. 88° 18' W., beginning new measurement.

Descend 25 ft. over NW. slope.

- 1.20 Enter Ash Valley, leave timber, edges bear NE. and S.; desc. slightly across Ash Valley.
- 5.30 Lake Creek, 60 lks. wide, course N.; asc. slightly across Ash Valley.
- 18.45 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. and S.; leave Ash Valley, enter logged area and dense undergrowth; asc. 470 ft. over E. slope, changing to SE. slope.
- 39.83 The cor. of secs. 11, 12, 13 and 14.

 Land, mountainous.
 Soil, rocky clay and loam.
 Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, chingquapin, yew and myrtle; undergrowth, blackberry, willow, hazel, arrowwood, vine maple, vines and ferns.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the notes of the foregoing resurvey are located in Ash Valley and surrounding mountains about a mile south of Loon Lake. Elevations range from about 400 feet above sea level near the ¼ section corner of sections 12 and 13, to about 1200 feet above sea level where the line between sections 13 and 18 crosses the ridge on the north half mile.
