CHAINS

The area is drained by Lake Creek and its tributaries which flow in a northerly direction into Loon Lake. The main access in the area is by a paved road through the section and several dirt and gravel roads branching from it.

There are a number of small ranches in the area with the grass lands being used for grazing purposes. Timber in the mountainous area is fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, myrtle, dogwood, chinquapin and yew. The undergrowth consists of vine maple, blackberry, salmonberry, hazel, poison oak, arrowwood, salal, willow, vines and ferns.

No mineral deposits were noted along the lines resurveyed.

The average of a number of readings along the lines resurveyed gives a value of 19 45' E. in mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 0 38' in local attraction.
