CHAINS

Deposit the iron pipe alongside the iron post.

Land, rolling hills.

From the cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15, and 16.

S. 88° 33' W., bet. secs. 9 and 16.

Ascend 320 ft. over E. slope, through scattering timber and light undergrowth.

A white oak, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 43° W., 87 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

From the SE. cor. of Donation Land Claim No. 41, perpetuated by A. Boyer, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1937, from original evidence no longer in existence, monumented with an iron rod, 1/2 in. diam., firmly set, protruding 4 ins. above ground, from which bearing trees marked by Boyer in 1937

A fir stump, 28 ins. diam., bears S. 5° E., 71 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A cedar stump, 38 ins. diam., bears S. 35° W., 65 lks. dist., with no marks visible on rotted blaze.
