

14330 County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 33 S., R. 5 W.

CHAINS

A broken cedar stump, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 63-1/2° E., 32 lks. dist., with scribe marks CQ CS BT visible on open blaze.

A Douglas fir stump, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 55° W., 36 lks. dist., with scribe marks Q 11 CS B visible on open and rotted blaze.

Descend 5 ft. over nearly level ground.

2.10 Dirt road, 10 lks. wide, bears NW. and SE.

7.50 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course S. 65° W.; asc. 20 ft. over nearly level ground

21.46 The closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron pipe, 2-1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, protruding 2 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record of the 1965 dependent resurvey.

From this point the angle point of secs. 1 and 35 bears S. 89° 40' E., 4.12 chs. dist., which is monumented with a brass cap, 2-1/2 ins. diam., firmly set marked and witnessed as described in the official record of the 1965 dependent resurvey.

Land, mountains with bottom land in the northerly portion. Soil, rocky clay in mountains and sandy loam in bottom land. Timber, fir, pine, cedar, and madrone; undergrowth, live oak, willow, manzanita, poison oak, huckleberry, fern, and reproduction.

Subdivision of Section 1, T. 33 S. , R. 5 W.

From the 1/4 sec. cor. 1f secs. 1 and 12.

N. 1° 06' W., on the N. and S. center line of sec. 1.

Descend 150 ft. over N. slope, through heavy timber and moderate undergrowth.

6.15 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 30° W. and S. 15° E., in a curve.

13.00 Quines Creek, 10 lks. wide, course N. 40° W.; asc. 65 ft. over SW slope.

18.90 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 50° W. and S. 70° E., in a curve.

19.775 Point for the center S 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 1.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2-1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
