

Subdivision of Section 1, T. 33 S., R. 5 W.

CHAINS

- Descend 110 ft. over SW. slope.
- 22.25 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. and S.
- 24.55 Irrigation ditch, 3 lks. wide, course N. 10° W.; also leave timber; edge bears N. 10° W. and S 10° E.; enter open field.
- 32.30 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears NW. and SE.; leave field, edge bears same as road.
- 33.80 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course N.; desc. 40 ft. over SW. slope, across logged area.
- 35.00 Gravelled driveway, 15 lks. wide, bears N. and S.
- 40.00 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 35° W. and S. 35° E.
- 42.80 Quines Creek, 25 lks. wide, course N. 50° W.; asc. 15 ft. over NE. slope.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in this resurvey are located about 10 miles east of the hamlet of Glendale, Oregon. The elevation ranges from about 2,000 feet above sea level to about 3,300 feet above sea level. Access to the area is gained by way of Quines Creek Road.

The timber in this area consists of Douglas fir, white fir, ponderosa pine, incense cedar and madrone. The undergrowth consists of conifer reproduction, manzanita, live oak, poison oak, Oregon grape, huckleberry, and willow.

No new mineral deposits were noted along the lines surveyed; however, former ditches and excavations used for mining were noted.

The mean magnetic declination, as determined from several observations throughout the area, is 20° E., with a range of 1° 30' in local attraction.
