Land, mountainous.  
Soil, rocky clay loam.  
Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, and alder; undergrowth,  
salal, hazel, poison oak, vine maple, and Oregon grape.

Township 22 south, range 10 west, is located in the foot hills of the coast range in mountainous Douglas County, on the north side of Loon Lake, about 4 miles southwesterly from Scottsburg, Oregon. Access is by way of the Oregon State Highway No. 38 to the Loon Lake Junction, then southeasterly on Mill Creek Road approximately 4 miles. There are a number of gravelled and dirt roads branching off from Mill Creek Road which also provides access. The area is drained mainly by Camp Creek, which flows generally northwesterly into Mill Creek, and a number of smaller streams branching off from these. The elevations range from about 400 feet
