CHAINS

above sea level, along the bottom lands, to about 1300 feet above sea level, near the 1/4 section corner of sections 24 and 25. The area is forested with scattering to dense stands of fir, hemlock, cedar, oak, maple alder, myrtle, chinquapin, dogwood, and madrone. The undergrowth consists chiefly of salal, salmonberry, blackberry, hazel, rhododendron, arrowwood, young timber, poison oak, Oregon Grape, and fern. There are few permanent residents settled along the numerous bottom lands. The area is valuable mainly for timber, with some grazing in the bottom lands. No mineral deposits were noted along the lines resurveyed.

The average of a considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a mean magnetic declination of 20° 22' east. There is a range of up to 1° due to local attraction.
