Ascend 15 ft. over NE. slope, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

- 2.70 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 200 ft. over NW. slope.
- 9.75 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N.; asc. 55 ft. over NE. slope.
- 16.45 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 15 ft. over NW. slope.
- 35.50 Dirt road, 10 lks. wide, bears N. 45° W. and S. 45° E.
- 40.04 The cor. of secs. 17, 18, 19, and 20.

- 20.105 Point for the E 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 18 and 19.
