GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the foregoing survey are located approximately 4 miles south of Riddle, Oregon. The area is drained by Russel Creek, which flows in a northwesterly direction, and by Shoestring Creek, which flows in a northerly direction through section 2. The elevations range from about 1040 feet above sea level at the corner of sections 1, 2, 35, and 36, to about 2240 feet above sea level at the 1/4 section corner of sections 1 and 12.

Access is gained by way of an asphalt surfaced road running between Riddle and Canyonville, Oregon, Shoestring Road, and numerous gravelled roads leading into the area.

Soil in the area is composed of sandy clay loam, generally only a few inches in depth. Timber consists of fir, madrone, hemlock, white oak, and cedar; undergrowth consists of vine maple, poison oak, live oak, Oregon grape, manzanita, fern, and salal.

No evidence of mineral deposits was noted in the area covered by the survey.

The average of a number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 19° 00' E. for the mean magnetic declination, with a range of 0° 30' in local attraction.
