Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines,
T. 30 S., R. 7 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon.

CHAINS

31 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 42 1/2° W., 45 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

N. 0° 38' W., bet. secs. 29 and 30, marking and blazing the true line.

Descend 304 ft. over NW. slope, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

12.10 Ravine, drains N. 80° W.; asc. 17 ft. over SW. slope.

13.25 Spur, slopes N. 40° W.; desc. 407 ft. over NW. slope.

17.90 Dirt road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. 75° E. and S. 75° W.

32.40 Ravine, drains N. 50° E.; asc. 28 ft. over SE slope.

36.95 Top of ascent, slopes E.; desc. 12 ft. along E. slope.

38.56 The cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29, and 30, monumented with the original basalt stone, 18 x 14 x 7 ins., loosely set, protruding 15 ins. above the ground, mkd. with 2 grooves on S., and 5 grooves on E. faces, from which the remaining original bearing trees:

A madrone, 11 ins. diam., bears N. 40° E., 28 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A burned fir stump, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 50° W., 48 lks. dist., with axe marks visible on burned blaze.

A burned fir snag, 25 ins. diam., bears N. 33° W., 41 lks. dist., no marks visible.

Set an iron post 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 10 ins. in the ground, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 6° E., 132 lks. dist., mkd. T30S R7W S20 BT.

A fir, 33 ins. diam., bears S. 4° E., 174 lks. dist., mkd. T30S R7W S29 BT.

A sugar pine, 32 ins. diam., bears N. 32 1/2° W., 187 lks. dist., mkd. T30S R7W S19 BT.

A stone, 5 ft. x 4 ft. x 3 ft., bears S. 54° W., 36 lks. dist., mkd. X BO on NE. face.

Deposit the stone alongside the iron post.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, Rocky clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, pine, cedar, alder, and maple; undergrowth fern, hazel, wild rose, rhododendron, and manzanita.
